Education Team Description:

Merck Forest and Farmland Center's (MFFC) Education Team is responsible for ensuring that all constituents (visitors, participants, volunteers, etc.) have access to high quality, mission- focused opportunities to deepen their connection to the land by exploring ecosystem structure and processes, observing and participating in regenerative agriculture and sustainable forestry, and developing a personal land ethic.

Position Description:

The Field Educator, with the assistance of a camp counselor, will lead week-long summer camp sessions, facilitating a positive camp experience of exploration and learning for all participants. Field Educators are responsible for planning, leading, and implementing camp programming with exciting and interesting hands-on activities around agriculture, forest, and aquatics. Field Educators will provide high quality experiences for participants that focus on environmental topics for campers ranging in age from Grade 1 through Grade 8.

Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with the Education Manager and Education Director to help design and deliver nature-based camp programs for Grades 1 6 focused on the woods, farm, and water.
- Collaborate with the Education Manager and Education Director to help design and deliver nature-based camp programs for Grades 7 & 8 focused on survival and backcountry skills and land stewardship.
- Facilitate group building activities throughout the week that build a strong and cohesive team that values everyone's voice, ideas, and needs.
- Administer first aid as needed for injuries and illness, and document all care given.
- Communicate with the Education Manager and/or Education Director, and parents about camper experiences and concerns.
- Document and report incidents and to the Education Manager and/or Education Director, giving up dates as needed.
- Maintain open communications with Camp Counselor assigned to camp.
- Supervise and support Camp Counselor, delegating some activities and responsibilities to allow for clear opportunities for leadership, and giving constructive feedback.
- Know and understand all emergency procedures and safety guidelines associated with the camp program and Merck Forest and Farmland Center.

- Undergraduate or advanced degree in education or environmental field.
- 2 or more years experience teaching children in classroom and/or field settings, or experience as a field
 naturalist or biologist along with a natural affinity for education and a high comfort level instructing children
 at various ages.
- Ability to teach and make decisions as part of a collaborative team.
- Knowledgeable in outdoor and survival skills such as tracking, shelter building, knot tying, group building initiatives.
- Comfortable handling small, harmless wildlife, including insects, reptiles, and amphibians.
- Experience with working with students in an outdoor setting.
- Willingness to be flexible and ready to meet changing work needs and demands.
- A supportive and non-punitive approach to discipline
- Demonstrate leadership skills
- Ability to pass FBI background check
- Wilderness First Aid and CPR/AED (WFR preferred)
